#### Attached are:

Estimates for base flow pump.

The main lift station is in need of a base flow pump. The three large waste water pumps are designed for high flows and do not function well for base flow conditions (>60% of the year). A new base flow pump will allow the large pumps to operate without excessive cycling.

- 1. The estimate for the base flow pump is \$18,000.
- 2. SCADA integration and electrical equipment is estimated at \$10,000.
- 3. Labor by Public Works Crew is estimated at \$12,000.

I recommended approving a capital outlay for 2018 Base Flow Pump project for an amount not to exceed \$40,000.

#### Introduction

Dear Karl,

CRC is pleased to present this proposal for an archeological assessment for the proposed excavations for the City of Goldendale's proposed 2.14 acre Little League Parking Improvement Project. This proposal provides an outline of the Tasks and Deliverables, and a cost breakdown to develop an onsite survey and subsurface testing and reporting that will meet compliance with requirements from the Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation (DAHP) for protecting and avoiding precontact resources in the archeologically sensitive area.

Fundamentally, my tasks (a Phase I Inventory) are directed to determine whether there are archaeological resources within the proposed areas of potential ground disturbing activities for the above referenced project, called the Areas of Impact (AOI), and then assessing if the project would have adverse effects to those resources.

#### Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation File Review

#### Precontact Sites 45KL2137 and 45KL2138.

A brief review of records on file in the Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation (DAHP), database, indicate the project area is in an high probability area for archaeolgical resources since there are at least 14 historic and precontact sites within one mile of the project area. This includes two small multicomponent archaeolgical sites adjacent to the south end of the field. The proposed project has the potential to encounter archaeolgical materials similar to- or associated with these sites. Therefore a systematic pedestrian surface survey will need to be conducted as well as an appropriate amount subsurface testing and screening to characterize the soils and examine the soil profiles for archaeolgical deposits.

CRC has developed the following proposal under the assumption that buried (archeological) materials may be encountered during monitoring, so I will include a protocol for documentation and consultation with the DAHP and Tribes and includes the development of a single Washington Site Form in the scope of work. In the event that archaeolgical materials are identified during the field survey portion of the project, CRC will immediately contact you and we will discuss how to avoid and protect and document the resources, creating a work-around if possible, and only proceed after

appropriate consultation, which will include the DAHP and possibly effected Tribes including the Yakama.

In the event there is any other unanticipated discovery that will require additional archaeological services beyond the scope of work provided, CRC would provide an additional scope of work based on the finds and after proper notification, consultation and agreement with the DAHP and Tribe and all other parties on how to proceed.

The period of performance extends from acceptance of the scope of work until completion of the study and tasks described within. All archaeolgical field work and reporting will be directed by CRC professional archaeologist Genavie Thomas M.S. who meets and exceeds the Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualification Standards set forth in Title 36 of the Code of Federal Regulations [CFR], Part 61.

#### Work Plan and Schedule

The following work plan details the methods that will be used by CRC during a pedestrian survey and subsurface investigative testing of the project Area of Impact. The project will be conducted under an Inadvertent Discovery plan should human remains be encountered during the field investigations (see below). All archaeolgical field work and reporting will be directed by CRC professional archaeologist Genavie Thomas M.S. who meets and exceeds the Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualification Standards set forth in Title 36 of the Code of Federal Regulations [CFR], Part 61.

#### Phase I Identification-Archaeolgical Inventory Survey

#### Project Tasks

CRC will conduct all work in compliance with guidelines established by the DAHP guidelines for cultural resources inventory and reporting which can be accessed online (http://www.dahp.wa.gov/survey-inventory). CRC will proceed in the following series of related phases, each of which builds upon information gained from preceding results.

1. Conduct a Pedestrian Survey of the Parcel: This is done in order to identify and document cultural resources, including any features or artifacts on the surface of the parcel. A pedestrian survey entails conducting research including examination of historic maps and archival materials to assist with the research plan for the project. The field work will include a systematic visual inspection of

the surface of the field at a set interval in order to identify any cultural resources exposed on the ground surface (e.g., prehistoric flaked- and ground stone tools or debitage, portable historic-era artifacts and non-portable features, or other engineered phenomena).

2. Conduct a Subsurface Testing of the APE: CRC proposes to conduct investigative testing within the proposed parcel with excavation of Constant Volume Sample (CVS) units systematically across the parcel. If CRC should encounter fill deposits then CRC will employ a 10 inch diameter augur which can probe to around 3 meters or 12 feet below surface (if need be). The location of the CVS and/or augur units will be determined in the field by CRC.

The proposed CVS units will be approximately 35cm diameter cylindrical units, excavated, screened through 3.2-mm (1/8-in) mesh hardware cloth and examined for artifacts, and documented in volumetric 10 liter "levels", using graduated buckets a specialized form. The documentation of the CVS units will include excavation notes for each separately excavated and screened volumetric level, including soil/sediment description and cultural materials found. Upon completion, a stratigraphic profile sketch will be drawn and a photograph documenting the CVS profile will be taken. This data will be transcribed and placed in the survey report.

If any artifacts are identified, they will be bagged, and labeled according to Washington archaeological standards, including site number, date, excavator, unit, level, bag number and artifact type and number(s) placed back in the hole.

In order to develop a detailed sketch map, CRC will record each test unit, as well as point data (such as the site datum and other important features) with a Trimble GPS unit. All GPS data will be exported into ArcMap 10 shapefiles and plotted an aerial photograph to ensure accuracy and produce a location maps of all test units. A UTM will be provided for the datum point which will illustrated on the sketch map.

3. Technical Reporting and Deliverables: CRC will produce a technical report of findings for the investigation that will also include a project introduction and description, a summary of the pre-field archival research, an environmental context statement, a cultural/historic context statement, a research design and methods section, and descriptions and recommended evaluations of any cultural resources documented.

Included in the report will be historic references, tabular testing data, photographs, cartographic figures generated from the CRC GIS depicting the Project vicinity and the project elements, as well as site form(s) documenting identified archaeolgical resources (in an Appendix). CRC will complete and deliver a draft technical report of findings as a MS Word document for your review. CRC will respond to comments received and deliver a final report with all associated maps and images as an Adobe Acrobat field (.pdf). CRC will also include GIS data (a shapefile) and any updated archaeolgical site boundary data for submission to the DAHP if necessary.

#### **Inadvertent Discovery Protocol**

If any human remains are observed, all work should cease and the immediate area secured. State Physical Anthropologist Dr Guy Tasa, Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation (360-586-3534) will be contacted immediately. Dr. Guy Tasa, will assist in coordinating the immediate notification of the local Klickitat County Sheriff's Office, as well as the Klickitat County Coroner, David R. Quesnel. Guy Tasa will make a determination on whether the remains are Native American or non-Native. If the remains are determined to be Native American, Dr. Tasa will contact the affected tribes. All tribal consultation will be handled by DAHP. The project will only be able to proceed after a treatment plan for the remains has been developed. Compliance with all applicable laws pertaining to archaeological resources (RCW 27.53, 27.44 and WAC 25-48) and human remains (RCW 68.50) is required. Failure to comply with this requirement could constitute a Class C Felony.
