## **ORDINANCE NO. 1489**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1478 WHICH IS THE 2018 BUDGET, AND PROVIDING FOR INCREASED APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE CURRENT EXPENSE FUND, CITY STREETS FUND, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FUND, CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND, AND THE WATER/SEWER FUND.

**WHEREAS**, it has become necessary to decrease and increase appropriations in several funds below or above the original estimates, and

WHEREAS, sufficient funding exists, now therefore,

## THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GOLDENDALE, WASHINGTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Ordinance No. 1478 is hereby amended as follows:

<u>Section 1:</u> The Current Expense Fund is increasing its appropriations in the amount of \$525,000 to cover the Capital Outlay purchase of patrol cars and a fire truck. Revenues to cover the increased appropriations will come from loan proceeds through LOCAL funding from the Washington State Treasurer's Office.

Section 2: The City Streets Fund is increasing its appropriations in the amount of \$397,000 to cover costs of several capital outlay projects including the LED Street Lighting project, the WCNIP Project and the South Columbus Overlay Project. Revenues to cover the increased appropriations will come from increased grant monies from the Transportation Improvement Board, the STP funds from Klickitat County, transfer from the Capital Improvement Fund and available cash reserves.

<u>Section 3:</u> The Economic Development Fund is increasing appropriations in the amount of \$100,000 to cover increased expenses related to the loan payoff payment to CERB due to the purchase of two Industrial Park properties. Revenues to cover the increased appropriations will come from the property purchase agreement.

<u>Section 4:</u> The Capital Improvement Fund is increasing appropriations in the amount of \$20,000 to cover increased expenses related to the South Columbus Overlay project. Revenues to cover the increased appropriations will come from available cash reserves.

<u>Section 5:</u> The Water Sewer Fund is increasing appropriations in the amount of \$240,000 to cover capital outlay purchase of 4 public works vehicles and increased expenses related to the loan payoff payment to CERB due to the purchase of two Industrial Park properties. Revenues to cover the increased appropriations will come from loan proceeds through LOCAL funding from the Washington State Treasurer's Office and from available cash reserves.
