EXPLANATION:

Ordinance no. 1227 to effect on June 20, 2023, imposing a 6-month immediate moratorium on the filing, acceptance, processing and/or approval of applications for the development of the RV parks. RCW 35a.63.22 requires the public hearing to beheld of the passage of the moratorium.

CITY OF GOLDENDALE

ORDINANCE NO. 1527

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GOLDENDALE, WASHINGTON, IMPOSING AN IMMEDIATE MORATORIUM ON THE FILING, ACCEPTANCE, PROCESSING AND/OR APPROVAL OF APPLICATIONS FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF RV PARKS; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, RCW 35A.63.220 and other applicable statutes and laws, authorize the City Council to impose a moratorium upon development applications for properties, including, but not limited to, applications for division of land and for building permits; and

WHEREAS, RCW 35A.63.220 provides that a City Council may impose such a moratorium without holding a prior public hearing, provided that a public hearing is held within sixty (60) days of the passage of the moratorium; and

WHEREAS, GMC General Commercial District (C-2) and Highway Commercial District (also referred to GMC 17.20.020 and 17.22.020) lists RV Parks as a principal use; and

WHEREAS, this moratorium is to address the issue of principal use RV Park development within the City limits without providing opportunity to the surrounding and general public to participate in the decision through a public hearing process; and

WHEREAS, Goal 1 of the City of Goldendale Comprehensive Land Use Plan policy 1.6 states, "public opinion regarding issues shall be sought and considered as part of the decision-making process. By imposing this moratorium, it will allow additional time to for City Council to explore options and draft new land use regulations regarding the development of RV parks and public opportunity to participate in decision process; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has expressed a desire to discuss policies addressing RV Parks in GMC General Commercial District (C-2) and Highway Commercial District the city; and

WHEREAS, the City believes a moratorium on applications of RV Parks is in the City's best interest to provide; and

WHEREAS, RCW 36.70A.390 authorized the City Council to adopt an immediate moratorium for a period of up to 6 months without holding a public hearing on the proposal if a public hearing is held within at least 60 days of its adoption; and

WHEREAS, RCW 36.70A.390 also provides an extension of up to an additional 6 months is possible if there is work plan developed for related studies; and

WHEREAS, RCW 35.63.200 provides a similar process for adopting and extending land use moratoriums; and

WHEREAS, moratoriums enacted under RCW 36.70A.390 and/or RCW 35.63.200 are methods by which local governments may preserve the status quo so that new regulations will not be rendered moot by intervening projects; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to WAC 197-11-880, the adoption of this ordinance is exempt from the requirements of a threshold determination under the State Environmental Policy Act; and

WHEREAS, there are no known pending applications for RV Parks at the time of enactment; and

WHEREAS, the City Council concludes that the City has the authority to establish a moratorium and that the City must adopt a moratorium concerning the filing, acceptance, and processing of new RV parks.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GOLDENDALE, WASHINGTON, DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Moratorium Imposed. A moratorium is imposed on the filing, acceptance and processing of new applications for RV parks, as said terms is used in GMC General Commercial District (C-2) and Highway Commercial District of the City of Goldendale. During the term of this moratorium, the City will not continue to accept and process new applications for manufactured home parks, however, this moratorium will not apply to any pending applications that were counter complete, as provided in the Sequim Municipal Code before the effective date of this ordinance.
- <u>Section 2.</u> <u>Duration of Moratorium.</u> The moratorium imposed by this Ordinance will be in effect for a period not to exceed six months, beginning on the date of the adoption of this Ordinance.
- <u>Section 3.</u> <u>Public Hearing on Moratorium. Pursuant to RCW 36.70A.390</u>. The City Council must hold a public hearing on this moratorium within 60 days of passing this ordinance. Immediately after the public hearing, the City Council must adopt findings of fact on this moratorium to justify its continued imposition or cancel the moratorium.
- <u>Section 4.</u> Corrections. The City Clerk and the codifiers of this ordinance are authorized to make necessary clerical corrections to this ordinance including, but not limited to, the correction of scrivener's/clerical errors, references, ordinance numbering, section/subsection numbers and any references thereto.
- Section 5. Savings Clause. Those portions of Ordinance (Ord. 1438 §2, 2014) and (Ord. 1438 §2(part), 2014) which are repealed or amended by this ordinance shall remain in force and effect until the effective date of this ordinance.

Such repeals and amendments shall not be construed as affecting any existing right acquired under the ordinances repealed or amended, nor as affecting any proceeding instituted thereunder, nor any rule, regulation, or order promulgated thereunder, nor the administrative action taken thereunder. Notwithstanding the foregoing actions, obligations under such ordinances or permits issued thereunder and in effect on the effective date of this ordinance shall continue in full force and effect, and no liability thereunder, civil or criminal, shall be in any way modified. Further, it is not the intention of these actions to reenact any ordinances or parts of ordinances previously repealed or amended, unless this ordinance specifically states such intent to reenact such repealed or amended ordinances.

<u>Section 6.</u> <u>Severability.</u> If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance.

Section 7. Emergency Declaration and Effective Date. Therefore, the City's moratorium must be imposed immediately to prevent any development rights from vesting and preserve the City's ability to process applications under valid codes. Without a moratorium, new RV parks would become vested under current code, which may frustrate City policy. This ordinance, passed by a majority plus one of the whole membership of the City Council as a public emergency ordinance necessary for the protection of the public health, public safety, public property, or public peace, shall be effective immediately upon its passage.

BYLAWS

THE GOLDENDALE AIRPORT ADVISORY BOARD of the City of Goldendale, Washington

ARTICLE 1

PURPOSE AND ORGANIZATION

SECTION 1. The purpose of The Goldendale Airport Advisory Board is to provide advice and recommendations to the City Council on matters of policy and strategic long-term development issues affecting the Goldendale Municipal Airport. The Board will serve in an advisory capacity.

SECTION 2. Said Goldendale Airport Advisory Board shall consist of, not to exceed, seven members. Members shall be recommended by the community and shall be appointed by the City Council. No more than three members may be hangar lessees, the remaining four members should consist of Goldendale citizens and/or Goldendale business owners or managers. The Goldendale Airport Commissioner (who is a City Council member appointed by the council) shall serve as ex officio member of such board.

The Board does not believe it should establish term limits. While term limits could help ensure that there are fresh ideas and viewpoints available to the Board, term limits involve the disadvantage of losing the contribution of members who have been able to develop, over a period of time, increasing insight into the airport and its operations and, therefore, provide an increasing contribution to the Board as a whole. As an alternative to term limits, the Board will review each member's continuation on the Board at least every three years or as deemed necessary. This will allow each member the opportunity to confirm his or her desire to continue as a member of the Board and the Board to consider the appropriateness of the member's continued service. A vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as an original appointment.

The members shall receive no compensation for their services but may be reimbursed for all necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties as members of such Board; provided, that all such expenses shall be approved for reimbursement by the Goldendale City Council prior to the time they are incurred.

Any member may be removed by the appointing authority for the same cause as any appointive officer of the city council.

ARTICLE II

POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE GOLDENDALE AIRPORT ADVISORY BOARD

SECTION 1. The Goldendale Airport Advisory Board will be advisory to the City Council and may take no action that binds the City of Goldendale. Board members shall abstain from participation in discussions or matters in which they may have a financial or vested interest.

In the event of such an interest, a Board member shall disclose to the Board that such an interest exists and recuse herself/himself from further participation in that matter.

SECTION 2. The Goldendale Municipal Airport Advisory Board shall advise the City Council and make recommendations on the following topics:

- All matters affecting airport management.
- All matters affecting airport construction, improvement, and operation.
- All matters affecting airport expansion and maintenance.
- Planning and developing airport services.
- The selection of all fixed base operators and other leases located at the airport.
- The terms, conditions, duties, responsibilities, consideration, and other lease provisions to be contained in all lease arrangements concerning airport property.
- Submitting a first draft budget to the City Council for the expenditure of revenues at the airport.

ARTICLE III

MEETINGS OF THE GOLDENDALE AIRPORT ADVISORY BOARD

SECTION 1. Regular meetings of the Goldendale Airport Advisory Board shall be set annually by the Goldendale Airport Advisory Board. Said meetings shall be monthly for the first two years, and maybe reduced for year three, but not less than quarterly.

SECTION 2. The City Clerk or other authorized representative shall prepare a notice of the meeting and an agenda of all matters to come before the meeting, and mail or deliver the same to the Goldendale Airport Advisory Board prior to the next regular meeting. Any officer of the Goldendale Airport Advisory Board or the Goldendale Airport Commissioner may cause matters to be placed on the agenda by advising the City Clerk no later than 12:00 noon one week preceding the next regular meeting.

SECTION 3. Special meetings of the Goldendale Airport Advisory Board may be called by the Chairperson or Goldendale Airport Commissioner at any time by giving notice of the time and place of such meeting to all members thereof.

SECTION 4. A quorum shall consist of a majority of the members of the Goldendale Airport Advisory Board appointed and qualified at any given time.

SECTION 5. All meetings of the Goldendale Airport Advisory Board shall be conducted in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order.

ARTICLE IV

OFFICERS AND THEIR DUTIES

SECTION 1. The officers of the Goldendale Airport Advisory Board shall be as follows:

- Chairperson, who shall be elected by said Goldendale Airport Advisory Board from its numbers and shall preside at all meetings of the Goldendale Airport Advisory Board.
- <u>Chairperson Pro Tem</u>, who shall be elected by said Goldendale Airport Advisory Board from its numbers, and in the absence or disqualification or disability of the Chairperson shall perform duties of the Chairperson.

SECTION 2. The Goldendale Airport Advisory Board may appoint such other officers as the Goldendale Airport Advisory Board deems necessary.

SECTION 3. The Chairman and Chairman Pro-Tem shall be appointed by the Board. Any voting member is eligible for appointment. The Board will review each Officer's appointment at least every four years but at the Board's discretion may appoint new Officers at any time. Officers may resign at any time without affecting their status as a Member.

ARTICLE V

RULES AND PROCEDURES

The Goldendale Airport Advisory Board may adopt appropriate rules and procedures for the conduct of meetings and for the transaction of the Goldendale Airport Advisory Board's business.

ARTICLE VI

AMENDMENTS TO BYLAWS

SECTION 1. The Goldendale Airport Advisory Board may, by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote, amend these Bylaws or any provisions or section thereof, at any time when the same is not in conflict or in contravention of any of the laws of the State of Washington or ordinances applicable thereto, and such amendments shall be subject to approval by the City Council. Provided, however, that notice of the proposed amendments be furnished to the Goldendale Airport Advisory Board members not less than ten (10) days prior to the meeting at which said amendments are to be considered. A copy of the Bylaws will be filed with the office of the City Clerk.
